



CEZA was also able to gain a 1.50% increase in its total number of locators from 133 in the end of 2022 to 135 in the first quarter of 2023. Specifically, the additional enterprises were under the sectors of Business Management and Consultancy and Trading and Services. Meanwhile, 41 are only operating while the rest are yet to run.




CEZA GENERATED EMPLOYMENT




The total number of CEZAgenerated employment slightly decreased by 1.65% in this quarter. The decline was primarily due to a 55% decrease in foreign-generated employment compared to the 2022 data. This decline in foreign employment can be attributed to the non-renewal of CEZA registrations, mostly operated by non-Filipinos, during this period in review. On the other hand, employment generated for Cagayanos has consistently increased every quarter.








The total number of CEZA-working visas processed decreased by 55%, from 106 in the fourth quarter of 2022 to 47 in the first quarter of 2023. The decline was brought by the non-renewal of CEZA registered enterprises that used to need highly-technical personnel in their operations and the reduction of manpower needs of some locators.





There was a 42.66% increase of tourist arrivals from the first quarter of 2022 to the first quarter of 2023. The increase can be attributed to the gradual opening of the economy and the continuous efforts of CEZA and other tourism partners to revive the local tourism industry.






Out of the four ongoing infrastructure projects of CEZA, two are coming into completion and the other two are over fifty percent completed.


In the first quarter of 2023, CEZA was already able to generate revenue from port operations in the amount of P6,437,951.62. This is already 34.79% of the total revenue generated from port operations in the whole year of 2022.



The total number of shipcalls in the first quarter of 2023 has already reached the 50% total number of shipcalls in the first half of the year 2022. If this trend continues, CEZA will surpass its performance in 2022 on shipcalls by the second quarter of 2023.

Despite the absence of commercial flights, Cagayan North International Airport (CNIA) has remained operational and has accommodated flights of government and private groups. As of March 31, 2023, CNIA has recorded only chartered flights with a domestic destination. This indicates that while CNIA's commercial flight operations are currently suspended, the airport still serves as an important transport hub for government and private entities in the region.




The total income generated by CEZA-assisted organizations during this period is 62.57% lower than the quarterly average in 2022. This decline can be attributed to the non-operational status of the Casambalangan-Rapuli Environmental Protectors Association (CREPA) due to the destruction of their dam, which served as the main tourist attraction of their firm. Additionally, some assisted organizations in Santa Ana couldn't generate income due to weather-dependent operations in Santa Ana, as rain and strong winds persisted during the period in review.

Nonetheless, there are high expectations of a significant income increase in the 2nd quarter of 2023. This anticipation arises from the approach of the summer season and the reinstatement of the Viray Festival. 1,000,000
