







CEZA has been experiencing a steady growth in capital investments, raising the figures from \$\pm\$16,958,362,994.00 in the fourth quarter of 2022 to \$\text{P18,653,976,554.00} in the second quarter of 2023. This connotes an increase of P1,695,613,560.00 or 9.99%.






From 135 in the first quarter, the total number of CEZAregistered enterprises nose-dived by 31.57% or 91 in the second quarter. A significant number of this decrease was brought by the non-renewal of registration of registered enterprises under the financial technology solutions and offshore virtual currency exchange (FTSOVCE), from 45 licensees in the first quarter to only 13 in the second quarter. The drop in the non-renewal of their registration was also recorded in trading services operations that decreased from 16 to 11, interactive gaming operations that decreased from 14 to 11, integrated resorts operations that decreased from 17 to 16, mineral processing operations that decreased from 4 to 3, and construction operations that decreased from 4 to 3.

CEZA GENERATED EMPLOYMENT






The total number of employment generated through CEZA by its registered enterprises partially increased by 1.14% from the first to the second quarter. This holds true amid the significant fall of registered enterprises in the second quarter. This figure still falls short by 0.53% from the total employment generation in 2022. With its continued efforts, CEZA is confident that the third quarter will bring in more locators and employment.

CEZAISSUANCE OF WORKING VISA








Companies registered with CEZA can opt to hire foreign workers for any job vacancies that no Filipino is able, competent, and willing to do at the time of hiring. For this purpose, CEZA can also process and issue CEZA Working Visas (CWVs).

The total number of CWVs processed increased by 72.34%, from 47 in the first quarter to 81 in the second quarter of 2023. Notably, employment generation has increased with more locals hired.


As of June 30, 2023 CEZATOURIST ARRIVALS



A 147.41% increase in the tourist arrivals can be observed from the first quarter of 2023. This can be attributed to the summer season, when tourist arrivals in the CSEZFP is on its peak. There was also a 21.71% increase from the tourist arrivals in the second quarter of 2022 to the second quarter of 2023. The increase can be attributed to the gradual opening of the economy and the continuous efforts of CEZA and other tourism partners to revive the local tourism industry.



Out of the four ongoing infrastructure projects of CEZA, two are coming into completion and the other two are over fifty percent completed.



The total generated revenue from port operations grew by 30.97% in this period, from P6,437,951.62 in the first quarter of 2023 to P8,431,350.45 in the second quarter of the year, cumulatively. The generated revenue this quarter is 12.00% lower than the collected revenue in the second quarter of 2022.





The total number of shipcalls increased by 40% from 15 in the first quarter of 2023 to 21 in the second quarter of the year, cumulatively. The total number of shipcalls in the second quarter of 2023 is already 67.74% of the total number of shipcalls in 2022. With the presence of infrastructure development in Port Irene, including its retrofitting and rehabilitation, four-unit warehouse and warehouse offices, two-four-unit warehouse, and dredging and reclamation, more shipcalls will be accounted in the third quarter of the year.


GENERATED INCOME OF ASSISTED ORGANIZATIONS

#2,261,205.00 Total Generated Income of Assisted Organizations

The total generated income of CEZA-assisted organizations grew by 548,534.57%, having a revenue of ₱348,610.00 in the first quarter of 2023 and ₱1,912,595.00 in this quarter. This can be attributed to the rise of tourism arrivals in the second quarter of the year. Majority or 83% of the total generated income of CEZA-assisted organizations was earned by the Palaui San Vicente Motor Banca Association (PASAMOBA), followed by the Palaui Tour Guide (PTG) at 5.4%, and Pananacpan Eco-Tourism Association (PEPA) at 3.9%.
